




Sunniside Review and Masterplan kick off meeting.

A note from TOWN and Create Streets, January 2023.

- In December 2022, we began gathering a picture of the life and place of Sunniside in Sunderland. Through conversations with stakeholders living, working and operating in the area we began to piece together an initial picture of Sunniside, how it worked as a place for better and for worse so we could begin to understand why Sunniside hasn't flourished as a place that has 'great bones'.
- In January 2023, a couple of meetings were held with an initial group of Sunniside stakeholders. By no means all the people of Sunniside but a group diverse enough to check that we were beginning to understand the challenges and aspirations of the area.
- This is the presentation of the meeting. We didn't get all the information right and we've been given leads and signposts to better information. But this is a snapshot of what we understood in January 2023.
- It also sets out the masterplanning process we were beginning.



2020s Plans to redevelop The Tyre Shop, Norfolk Hotel and PS Antiques building and properties on Nile Street for creative and commercial uses.

> Housing development on the Nile and Villiers site coming forward.

Making Sunniside a success in the future means meeting challenges now...





Lack of People

Lack of footfall

There are lots of people using Sunniside but why doesn't this translate to footfall?

What stops people crossing Fawcett Street and in to Sunniside?

Limited destination beyond Sunniside and not easily walked.

Lack of money

There are not enough people spending their money in Sunniside.

Which people?

Who do we want to draw into Sunniside?



Why don't people go to Sunniside?

We need to drill down in to this question. There's lots of reasons to be there.



Safety and Security

Anti-social Behaviour

Experiences, sounds and sights of anti-social behaviour frighten people.

Shuttered and defended

Crime and repeated break-ins have meant businesses need to defend their premises.

Shutters on properties suggests to the public that the area is unsafe.

A neighbourhood for vulnerable people

The support services that are based in and around the Sunniside area mean that lots of vulnerable people are using the area.

Some of these people make others feel unsafe.



Under-used and unloved

Quiet on the street

There are lots of businesses in the area but there are not many people moving around the area.

People want to park right next to places of leisure and work. Do people enjoy the area?

Unviable

Gaps sites and empty or poorly maintained building 'says' to people that the area is not successful enough for people to invest in the area, or for investment to pay off.

Some buildings aren't empty but there isn't signage or signs of activity.

Poor development

Badly designed developments blight the area. Ground floors are left empty and property or businesses are unwelcoming.



Little awareness of Sunniside

Not clear what is on offer

Sunniside is home to lots of uses, businesses, services, homes. It is not a destination for one type of activity.

This is difficult to brand or market.

Few people know about it

Not many people living and working outside of the city centre know about the new developments in Sunniside.

People think to go elsewhere

This is a challenge to the whole city centre, competing with the Metrocentre and Newcastle, but recent developments at Seaburn have encouraged people to that area for leisure.



Stakeholders and Partners already at work

Initiatives to manage Anti-social behaviour

Multiple initiatives to address hostels and antisocial behaviour issues.

SAIL (Sunderland Altogether Improving Lives) launched in December 22, with partnership working to tackle anti-social behaviour in the city centre, including the area of Sunniside. (2022-2025)

Conservation Area Management Plan

A new area management plan is being developed for the Old Sunderland Conservation Area. This covers the north east area of Sunniside and will provide guidance and ideas for future development. (January 2023).

Neighbourhood Delivery Plans

The neighbourhood delivery plans will be refreshed in 2023.
